
Chapter III
THE HOLY SPIRIT:
The Principal Agent of Mission

Dear MI Members and Friends,

Let us continue our reflection on Blessed John Paul's encyclical, *Mission of the Redeemer*. Chapter III is titled, The Holy Spirit, The Principal Agent of Mission. He is the Agent Who sees to the accomplishment of the work of salvation *in the human spirit and in the history of the world*. Christ entrusted the work of salvation *to human beings: to the apostles and to the Church* but the Holy Spirit is the inspiration, the light, the Agent of grace.

Following the resurrection, Christ gave the missionary mandate to the apostles. This mandate has two main elements in the four gospels: 1) the universality, sent to all nations (Mt 28:19; Mk 16:15; Lk 24:47), 2) and the assurance from the Lord that the presence and power of the Spirit will always be with them. In this liturgical time we read and reflect on the spread of the faith (Acts 10), the first confrontations and the resolutions of the issues (Acts 15), and the discernment of where to evangelize in the world (Acts 16:6...). The Holy Spirit is the protagonist.

Each evangelist has different emphases for the mission entrusted to him. Mark presents mission as **proclamation** in imitation of Peter: "You are the Christ" (Mk 8:29). Matthew emphasizes the **foundation of the Church and her teachings** (cf. Mt 28:19-20; 16:18). Luke



proclaims the need to witness (cf. Lk 24:48; Acts 1:8) centered especially on the liberation from sin, and conversion to God's love and mercy. John speaks of the mandate, linking the mission which Christ received from the Father to the mission He is entrusting to his beloved apostles (Jn 20:21). The ultimate purpose of mission is to enable people to share in the communion which exists between the Father and the Son.

Blessed John Paul points out that from this pluralism of emphases of the one and same mission we must pay heed to the variety of missionary charisms and to the diversity of circumstances and peoples. *Mission, then is based not on human abilities but on the power of the risen Lord.* We can often get caught up in our human structures, our ways of interpreting and seeing something. The Spirit is not bound by our pettiness. He is God. "He does not ration his gift of the Spirit" (Jn 3:34).

We should read the Acts of the Apostles thoughtfully relishing, the birth and spread of the Church. In the Acts we witness the universality of the message. It is the Spirit who is the source of the drive to press on, not only geographically but also beyond the frontiers of race and religion. Reading the Act of the Apostles helps us to realize that at the beginning of the Church the mission ad gentes, while it had missionaries dedicated "for life" by a special vocation, was in fact considered the normal

meet the adorers. In a recent dialogue with a young man she sees there, she asked him what inspired him to come. He said his mother. She frequently came to adoration. He then said Our Lord told him to come pray there. In an afterthought he told her, "I'm not Catholic. I'm Protestant". I attended an inter-religious discussion on Mary. A Protestant pastor said that he goes almost weekly to Sunday Mass in the local Catholic Church. And jokingly he added, "Probably more than many Catholics."

As we join in prayer with our beloved Pope Benedict XVI and all the Church for the coming of the Holy Spirit, anew, at Pentecost, we ask that He hover the earth with His light and transforming grace to renew the hearts of all mankind. May we through our total consecration to the Immacualata, Spouse of the Holy Spirit, be open to His workings and presence, becoming fruitful ever more missionaries throughout the world of God's loving and redeeming message of life eternal.
